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Introduction

The Care Leaver Progression Partnership (CLPP) is a collective of organisations in Kent and Medway, joined in a commitment to improving the post-16 education and training experience for local children in care and care leavers. Our members are as follows:



The CLPP exists for the benefit of its members in serving the young people that they work with in Kent and Medway. We are a collective endeavour to better understand and remove the barriers to post-16 education and training for local children in care and care leavers.

All members commit to the partnership financially, and work to agreed Terms of Reference and objectives that are reviewed annually. All members sign an agreement which runs for three years.

The CLPP is governed by a steering group comprising of a representative from each member institution, and chaired by Canterbury College.

- ii) Seek funding to deliver the UASC project developed by Sussex NHS.

- iii) Continue to hold an annual conference, addressing key practitioner issues.

- iv) Set up a sub-group to interrogate the commissioned data report and identify ways to make best use of the data.

- v) Roll out the transition programme developed by the DMS group.
